Building Back Better in Bushfire Affected Areas Bushfire Recovery Victoria Grants

In a Media Release on 7 October, Jaclyn Symes MLC Minister for Emergency Services announced that Wairewa Public hall was granted \$49,967 funding under the Community Facilities Grants available through Bushfire Recovery Victoria. The upgrades will improve



amenity and safety at the hall for the community, particularly by upgrading the tennis court surface and lights, improving storage and accessibility.

East Gippsland Timber Milling Project

Debbie Brient from East Gippsland Timber Milling Project has provided an update to the Wairewa CRC & community on the Lucas Mills project and timelines. The millers are still working in Sarsfield and each property takes 3 weeks to a month to complete. Between Sarsfield and Mallacoota are 60 properties on the wait list and many more landowners who do not know about the project yet. The millers will not get to the 7 properties registered in Wairewa until next year. GOOD SHEPHERD LAUNCH ME BUSHFIRE RECOVERY MICRO-ENTERPRISE PROGRAM



While the Good Shepherd organization is new to East Gippsland it is a long established not for profit agency active in a broad range of social issues. Good Shepherd has been running micro-enterprise programs in South Australia and in the Dandenong and Latrobe Valley areas for several years. It has now been funded by Bushfire Recovery Victoria to run its Launch Me micro-enterprise program in East Gippsland for 12 months. The program essentially can assist people who are looking to establish self-employment OR who have an already established business that has suffered due to the impact of drought / bushfires / COVID.

The eligibility criteria are quite basic – people with an income of less than \$45,000 (from whatever sources) OR in the case of existing business – a turnover of less than \$75,000 and NOT registered for GST. For those businesses needing assistance but with a higher turnover there are other supports available. Good Shepherd has employed 2 micro-enterprise coaches to deliver the program – Cherie Draper and Neil Smith who will contact you if you register.

The program provides coaching and access to specialized services (such as accountants, lawyers, website developers, etc). There is also access to a range of training courses as well as access to the range of other services available through Good Shepherd. Coaching can be provided for up to 6 months. To date there has been a good response from the East Gippsland community and Cherie, Neil and Good Shepherd are keen to ensure the program is of great benefit to both individuals and communities. Free Mental Health Coaching from Wellways


Update on Wairewa Hall

The toilets have been fully completed, the BBQ shelter structure has been delivered but can't be erected until after Christmas. As you all know, shed construction in East Gippsland has a very large backlog as everyone rebuilds. Once the shelter is up, the concrete will be poured for the base and the sprinkler system can be finalised. The cabinet to house the O'Grady's Bridge model has been ordered as have the storage units. Construction on the storage is likely to be after Christmas also.

Introducing — East Gippsland Community Foundation

Michelle Dowsett, Executive Officer of the newly formed East Gippsland Community Foundation attended the Wairewa CRC Meeting on 27 October to brief the community on what the organisation offers.

East Gippsland Community Foundation will only fund projects delivered within East Gippsland or which directly benefit those who live in East Gippsland including:

- . Activities which have ongoing benefit to communities in East Gippsland
- Innovative undertakings
- Projects which are in keeping with the mission of the East Gippsland Community Foundation
- Project development activities that will assist the preparation of applications to other major grant programs. For example, the preparation of business plans, socioeconomic assessments, project design and costings
- In any Youth Support grant stream, assistance may be provided to individual students or groups of students or other young people.

The Foundation has \$8.8 million of Victorian Bushfire Appeal funding for activities related to bushfire recovery, disaster preparedness and planning.

Community Enterprise Foundation (the philanthropic arm of Bendigo and Adelaide Bank) and the Victorian Government are providing running costs and payments for directors and staff so it is not coming out of donations.

1st round of funding will open Friday 28th October; successful projects will be notified before Christmas. Next round will open February 2022.

A Scholarship fund will be launched in November for the younger cohort in bushfire affected areas. \$7000 for travel and accommodation related to applicants education.

EGCF funding will be complementary to funding rounds offered by other agencies and not double up on existing grants (ie: Community Facilities and LER).
