At the 10 November meeting, Wairewa CRC members made the decision to cancel all public CRC recovery events. The reasons for cancelling CRC public events are that COVID19 Safe marshalling of such events is "too bloody hard" for a small number of people, especially if case numbers continue to grow in Far East Gippsland and mandatory COVID vaccination means some community members are unable to attend.

The hall grounds are also very boggy with the long-term weather forecast for a very wet summer, renovations to the hall kitchen will be too disruptive and, with lockdowns lifting, CRC members want to see their families in the next month and will not be available in full strength to organize such events.

Freemasons Lakes Entrance Donated Diesel Generator Now Fully Operational

As one of the first major donations to the Wairewa community immediately after the fires, Freemasons Lakes Entrance were quick to respond and donated \$14,000 for a diesel generator, fire pump and concrete slab to the Wairewa Public Hall CoM to improve community resilience into the future. With this generous donation, the hall now has an uninterruptable power supply, the capacity to pump to a sprinkler system and a concrete base sited on the north side of the hall to secure the generator and pump to.

Recently, Darren Chester, Federal Member for Gippsland visited the hall. John Appleby, President of the CoM, took the chance to explain that the pictured 10kva Blue Diamond generator has now been hardwired to the hall switchboard and forms a continuous circuit with the solar system. Hall funds were used to

pay for the electrical works required to wire this circuit. If the mains power is cut off, then the diesel generator will automatically kick in to recharge the solar system batteries and then shut down once they are fully charged and the hall will run off the stored battery power. If we need to re-charge phones or other communication devices in the event of a prolonged blackout, we can do so at the hall. The generator is also programmed to test run every Monday at 12pm.
