# **CRC Grant Endorsement Framework**

#### Context

The Corryong Community Recovery Committee is required to endorse/support projects before they can be considered for some bushfire recovery grants. These include but not limited to BRV/NBRA LER grants, Victorian Bushfire Appeal fund grants.

Corryong CRC also needs to respond to requests for letter of support for other grant programs.

# **Terms of Reference:**

- advise Towong Shire and other funding bodies of the need for funding for community projects and
- assist other community groups to attract funding and provide assistance to support community recovery projects

### Key Principles The CRC grant endorsement process will endeavor to:

- Keep it simple
- Be timely in providing endorsement or advice on no endorsement
- Not require additional information than that already required by the proposed granting body.
- Decisions will not be subject to appeal

### **Endorsement**

The Community Recovery Committee will assess and rank grant applications against three criteria:

- community based proponent (does it benefit the community and address a community need?)
- proportion of relevant community benefiting from the project and
- alignment to the CRC priority areas and recovery goals.

## **Process:**

### **CRC** Review

Applications will be a standing agenda item and must be received by the Friday before the meeting.

CRC will review applications at the meeting. The applicant will be advised in writing on the success or rejection of the application as soon as possible following the CRC meeting. The written letter can be used by the applicant in any grant they are seeking.

Endorsement does not mean the grant application will be successful. Approval is the responsibility of the granting body.
